# Dylan the destroyer

DYLAN 'The Destroyer' Dronfield stormed to a magnificent medal victory in the first meeting of the PGS year.

The five-handicapper, who travels down from his Rutland home to compete in PGS events, romped around Worplesdon in four over par to claim both the lowest gross score and the Lord Riddell Memorial Trophy.

Dylan, aka "Danger Mouse", a senior news editor at Sky News and part-time crime novel writer, played in his first Wryter Cup last year and looks nailed on for a place this time after his imperious start to the 2016 season.

Despite one double-bogey, he was the only player in the 43-man field to score lower than his handicap in the one medal round on our calendar.

Dylan's only real rival on the day was in the competition to see who made the longest journey to Worplesdon. Defending Lord Riddell champion James Nursey completed a 300-mile round trip from his home in Shrewsbury and while he may not have gone home with any silverware he at least had the consolation of qualifying for the Emsley Carr knockout.

Former News of the World and Sun Sport back-bencher Tim Allan,

now relieved of the burden of PGS captaincy, was runner-up in Division One with a net 75, finishing just ahead of the returning Cornelius Bohane on countback.
