Take the exit from Maidenhead railway station that leads to Shoppenhangers Road. Turn right, proceed up the hill and the Golf Club is approximately 200 yards along on

Leave the motorway at Junction 4 and take the A404 towards Marlow and Henley. Come off at exit 9A signposted Cox Green/White Waltham, which is the last exit before the M4. At the
