From A3 London: At junction after Robin Hood Roundabout, take the A238 for Kingston. Follow the loop as you exit and turn left on to the A238 (Kingston). Golf Club Drive is on the right after about 600 yards.

From A3 (M25): Exit at A238 towards Kingston, double back as you follow the slip road and turn right on to the A238. Golf Club Drive is on the right.
