## King Khalid leads the way at Hadley

KING Khalid Javed stormed to victory at sun-kissed Hadley Wood

with a blistering 39 points.
Our very own 'Beast from the East' claimed the Mirror Trophy in sensational style, smashing his drives miles and making light of the Augusta-style greens to pip Peter Solomons on countback.

BBC man Khalid, who was playing off two under his handicap because of previous good rounds, is now all but certain of a place in the Wryter Cup team to play the French at Royal

Portrush in October.
Khalid said: "My only aim was to try to get a good finish so that I could get in the team for Portrush but I'm

so pleased to have won.
"The course was in great condition and I played about as well as I can. Now I can't wait to take on the French again.'

Hadley was set up for championship golf, having hosted a county match the day before we played. The pins were in the toughest positions and there were many stories of four putts - and at least one of five putts!

It made a welcome change from the last time we were at Hadley, back in 2015, when a monsoon meant only one round could be played.

That both Khalid and Peter scored so well on such a tough course bodes well as the race for Wryter Cup places really hots up.

With just two events to go, the final spots on captain Jonny Bramley's team will become clearer after our next meeting at Ashridge on Tuesday, July 25 and are finally decided on his day at Wyke Green on Tuesday, August 29.

Paul Trow completed the top three in the Mirror Trophy, scoring 37 points off 11 - two under his Muswell Hill club handicap!

In Division Two, evergreen Patrick Eagar destroyed the field, winning by an incredible five shots. The legendary cricket photographer was in sparkling form to score 37 points,



with Chris Stevens taking second on countback from new boy Jeremy Thompson.

Patrick's brilliant form continued into the afternoon, as he and partner Colin Hancock were only beaten in

the greensomes battle for the Wilkinson Sword on countback.

Both they and winners Ric Papineau and Gerry Cox scored 37 points, with Bryan Nickless and captain Bramley third on 34.

From M25: At exit 20 take the A41 towards Aylesbury.

Leave A41 at Chesham exit (A416) and follow signs to Berkhamsted. At traffic lights on the junction with Berkhamsted High Street turn left.

After a mile reach Northchurch. Turn right by school and church on to B4506 (called New Road) sign posted Ashridge.

After 3 miles the Club is on the right. Follow the private road to the clubhouse and car park.

BY TRAIN Berkhamsted station is just five miles and 12 minutes away.
