The Express features supremo, playing off 11, was in the first group out on the Old Course and roared round in a brilliant 39 points to seal victory.

Jim, right, who had to leave before the slightly delayed prize-giving, said: "Wow! I knew it was a good score but I was sure someone would come in with something better."

They certainly tried! Defending

champion Rob Hewer, playing his singles after lunch, also scored 39 points but a relatively lacklustre finish (at least by his high standards) saw him beaten on countback.

Evergreen captain Khalid Javed, who is rarely out of the prizes, picked up third place with 38 points.
