

Lew, what a scorcher! Golden Bear Steve storms to a 44pt triumph

STEVE LEWIS carved out his place in PGS history with a scorching 44-point victory at the impressive Bearwood Lakes.

The Sun sports sub, playing off 11, blitzed the brilliant Berkshire course to win the coveted News of the World Trophy with an outstanding display of high-class golf.

He left the field trailing in his wake, with Keith Malone a distant second in Division One on 40 points and secretary Tim Allan an even more distant third on 37.

Lewis, only cut from 12 after his Division One runners-up performance at The New Zealand, said: "I don't know where that came from but it was the round of my life.

"I just had one of those days where everything went right. I played well but I had some good luck as well."

In Division Two, Mirror man Tony Smith claimed the top prize with 41 points, one clear of Adam Hunt and four clear of Khalid Javed.

There was universal praise for

the Bearwood track, making its debut on the PGS rota thanks to the efforts of member Andy Glen.

With relatively generous fairways and lowish rough - but plenty of water - it proved a huge hit with the 36-strong field. Everything about Bearwood exudes class, from the tree-lined driveway to the opulent

clubhouse overlooking the 18th green.

If we're lucky enough to go back next year, don't miss it!

Former PGS stalwart Keith Ging, making his comeback after several years in the wilderness, partnered Division Two singles winner Tony Smith to win the afternoon greensomes.

They took the Sir Leicester Harmsworth Trophy with 43 points - yes, their greensomes winning score was less than Lewis's singles tally!

That was plenty good enough to

finish ahead of two pairs on 38 points, Glen and Peter Solomons taking the runners-up prize on countback ahead of Hunt and Jamie Weir.

The more observant will have noticed that Hunt scored more on his own than he managed with the help of Weir...make of that what

you will!


