Graham, who was a long-time member of Welwyn Garden City Golf Club, had a successful career with newspapers in Hertfordshire and Essex before joining The Sun in the mid-2000s. He worked in both the Dublin and London offices.

HOW TO GET THERE

By Car

Léave M25 at Junction 20, take the A41 towards Aylesbury.
Leave the A41 at Chesham exit (A416) and follow signs to Berkhamsted.
At traffic lights on the junction with Berkhamsted High Street turn left.

ASHRIDGE

After a mile reach Northchurch. Turn right by school and church on to B4506 (called New Road) signposted Ashridge.

After 3 miles the club is on the right. Follow the private road to the clubhouse and car park.

The nearest station is Berkhamsted, five miles and 12 minutes away.
