DOUBLE Emsley champion Andrew Porter has claimed yet another trophy with victory and a triumph for nominative determinism at Porters Park.

In fact Porter (right) also knew the course well, having played there as a boy, and his 36 points proved two too many for the rest of the field. The Brunswick man now adds the News of The World trophy to his cabinet.

"Porters Park was one of the first proper golf courses I ever stepped on", said former Telegraph political editor, "pulling my dad's trolley as he played for the local coppers versus the club about forty years ago. I also played there a bit as a junior and it undoubtedly helps knowing that layout."

Mike Allen claimed second, and the Division 2 prize, with 34 points, while Porters Park member Chris Smith took second in the

division with 33. PGS captain John Quinn was third just a point further báck.

Bearwood Lakes and Beeb man Andy Glen came second to Porter in Division 1 with 33 points,

edging out Laurence Lee on countback.



HOW TO GET THERE

By road: From the M3

Driving south on the M3, leave at junction 3 on the A322 towards Guildford.

Keep on this road for approximately 4 miles. Go past West Hill Golf Course on the left and then take the next left, Heath House Road. Proceed along this road, past Worplesdon Golf Club.

At the crossroads at the end, go straight across into Saunders Lane, then take an immediate left into Hook Heath Road.

Proceed for 1 mile along Hook Heath Road. At the first crossroads, take the diagonal left hand turning into Hollybank Road.

Go almost to the end of Hollybank Road, and then turn left into Golf Club Road.

(Beware of the speed bumps). Go to the very end and then turn into Pond Road and Woking Golf Club is at the very end. Go up to the gates and they will open automatically.

From the A3

Driving south on the A3, leave at the Burpham/ Jacob's Well exit.

Join the A320 and go towards Woking.

Mayford roundabout continue on the road
towards Woking and then at the next roundabout
turn left following the signs to St Johns.

Go up Wych Hill Lane to the next roundabout, go straight over into Wych Hill, go past the Co-op and the Renault garage.

Proceed straight on along Hook Heath Avenue and take the turning left immediately before the single lane railway bridge into Hollybank Road and then turn immediately right into Golf Club Road.

By train: There are direct services on South West Trains from London Waterloo. Trains stop at either Woking or Brookwood, where taxis are available.
